

Background on the Wellesley Service League:

The Wellesley Service League traces its roots back to the fall of 1927, when ten young women of Wellesley decided to organize their efforts to provide volunteer service to the community. The Service League originally concentrated its efforts on assisting the Wellesley Friendly Aid Association in several of its projects. Within one year, the League's membership increased to forty members, and service encompassed two enduring themes: Youth and Education; and HealthCare and the Elderly. Today the Wellesley Service League has between 75-80 active members and on average they provide more than 5,000 hours of service each year through their dedication and hard work. The growth in our reach of service has been consistent with the Founders' original charter of providing volunteer services to cultural, educational and other charitable organizations that serve the Town of Wellesley. We are proud of our contribution to the community and are committed to adapting to its changing needs in the future. WSL provides volunteer services to the following community organizations: Barton Road Boys and Girls clubs, Charles River Art and Music Therapy, Charles River Day Support, Dish and Deliver, Men's Group Program, Library Services, Tolles Parson Center, Newton Wellesley Hospital Thrift Shop, Food Pantry, Wellesley Symphony Orchestra, Flu Clinics, Toy Shop, Friendship Circle and Wellesley Historical Society.

Centennial Youth Service Award

The Wellesley Service League has presented the annual Centennial Youth Service Award for the last 35 years. This award is given by the League for outstanding volunteer service, preferably in our community. The applicant should be a Wellesley resident, completing his or her senior year in high school, who has demonstrated unusual dedication and selflessness in a volunteer capacity. Ideally, this service has been performed in the immediate area. Our mission is to not only recognize outstanding volunteer service among our youth but also to encourage the spirit of volunteerism in our community. Wellesley Service League will name up to two recipients this year. Recipients will receive a \$1,500 award from Wellesley Service League and their names will be engraved on a permanent plaque that hangs in the Wellesley Community Center.
